QUICK FACT FRIDAY

Did you know that the Town of Mount Pleasant was initially situated in Charleston County but became the Berkeley County seat when Charleston County was divided in 1883? This led to important preparations including the construction of the Berkeley County Court House located at the intersection of Pitt and King streets, now known as the Darby Building. The town already had 4 miles of shell-paved roads, nine shops, a brick and tile factory, a sawmill, and 783 residents. In 1895, Mount Pleasant was annexed back to Charleston County, and both counties refused to pay the overdue bill for bricks used to build the courthouse.). [READ MORE](#)
